Style (margins, header/footer, indents, footnotes, font size, Times New Roman for Latin fonts, Unicode for Greek<sup>1</sup>): use this template.

Abbreviations of classical works: apply those in *Oxford Latin Dictionary* or Liddell & Scott, *Greek-English Lexicon*.

Greek names and places should be Latinized as in *Oxford Classical Dictionary*<sup>3</sup>: Socrates, Cyzicus.

Numerals: do not use Roman, but Arabian.

Quotations: when you quote texts in lines or a form of paragraph, follow the examples below:

<sup>1</sup> Times New Roman is recommended for Windows users, and Times for Mac users. Transliterated Greek should only be used for words and phrases that are well established in English.

Works cited: Italic for books and journals. Indicate pages with the beginning and the end; e.g. Itsumi, K., *Pindaric Metre: The ‘Other Half’*. Oxford 2009, 1-15, Ito, S., Evidence, Theories and the Ancient Economy: A Critical Survey of Recent Work. *JASCA* 1 (2011), 5-25.

Abstracts: approximately 1,200 letters in Japanese, or 400 words in English to be attached for reviewing.

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
